The Greene County Board of Commissioners met in regular session on Monday, October 3, 2022, at 10:00 a.m. in the Greene County Operations Center. Present for the meeting: Chairman Bennie Heath, Vice Chairman James T. Shackelford Jr, Commissioners Jerry Jones, Susan Blizzard and Derek Burrell, County Manager Kyle DeHaven, County Attorney Gay Stanley and Deputy Clerk Kathy Mooring.

A. Call to Order

Chairman Bennie Heath called the meeting to order, and asked Commissioner Burrell to give the invocation and lead the Pledge to the Flag.

B. Approval of Agenda

Chairman Heath asked for any changes to the agenda. Commissioner Blizzard noted that today's meeting is at 10:00 a.m. not 10:00 p.m.

E. County Manager Report

1. Mr. DeHaven presented a Computer Use Policy. Mr. DeHaven stated this policy just puts in writing what we are already doing. This policy comes at the request of our auditors who want to see our written policy regarding computer/technology use as virtual crime continues to increase. Mr. DeHaven also stated that this policy is an acceptable start which again, is what we already practice, but will change as circumstances warrant.

On motion by Commissioner Jones and seconded by Commissioner Shackleford, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Computer Use Policy.

2. Mr. DeHaven next presented a Resolution for Surplus Property. Mr. DeHaven stated that these items are no longer needed or replaced by the County. These will be sold on Govdeals.com and the revenue will be credited back to the department for which the items were depreciated.

On motion by Commissioner Jones and seconded by Commissioner Shackleford, the Board voted unanimously to approve this Resolution for Surplus Property.

G. Commissioner's Report and Recommendations

Commissioner Burress congratulated Greene Central senior, Jonathon Willis on his commitment to play football for the United States Naval Academy. He also thanked the Greene Lamp Community Action for the new Hero's Garden at the Greene County Operations Center. He also thanked the EMS employees for doing some landscaping of their own at the EMS Station. He noted that the Greene County Chamber of Commerce is hosting a Taste of Greene on Tuesday, October 11th from 6 – 8 p.m. at Nooherooka. Tickets are only \$5.00 per person and there are still several tickets available. There will be a meet and greet of county officials and candidates. Several restaurants from Greene County will be participating. Contact Annell with Half-Moon Marketplace or Jennifer at Infinitylink. The Chamber invites everyone to attend. Commissioner Burress also noted that Fire Prevention activities will take place on October 12th and 14th at West Greene and Snow Hill Primary. On October 13th, the Boys and Girls Club will be honoring Greene County native, Tommy Eason on his 500th head baseball coaching win at the Junior College level at the City Club behind the Snow Hill Fire Department. That same evening the Town of Hookerton will be holding a candidate meet and greet event at the community center. He also noted that the county was blessed to have very little damage from Hurricane Ian, but we did suffer a loss this past weekend when someone decided to end their own life. 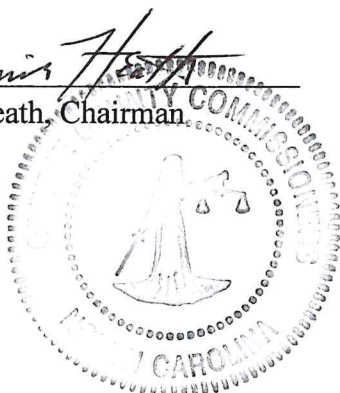

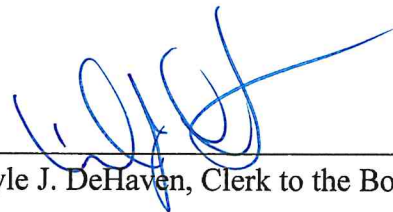
H. ADJOURN

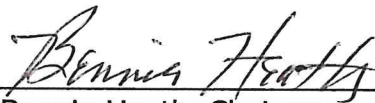


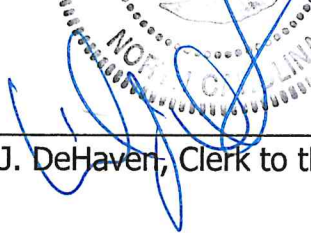
