The Greene County Board of Commissioners met in regular session on Monday, June 21, 2021 at 7:00 p.m. in the Wellness Center. Present for the meeting: Chairman Bennie Heath, Vice Chairman James T. Shackleford Jr, Commissioners Jerry Jones, Susan Blizzard, and Derek Burress, County Manager Kyle DeHaven, County Attorney Gay Stanley and Deputy Clerk Kathy Mooring.

A. Call to Order

Chairman Bennie Heath called the meeting to order, and asked Commissioner Burress to give the Invocation and lead the Pledge to the Flag.

B. Approval of Agenda

Chairman Heath asked if there were any changes to the agenda as presented. Seeing as there were none he called for a motion to approve.

On motion by Commissioner Jones and seconded by Commissioner Blizzard, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Agenda as presented.

C. Consent Agenda

Chairman Heath asked for any changes to the Consent Agenda, seeing as there was none he called for a motion to approve.

D. PUBLIC HEARINGS - Mr. Brandon Sutton stated that these four public hearings will bring us into compliance with new legislation in N.C.G.S. Chapter 160D. Mr. Sutton noted that these public hearings have been advertised as required and we are doing them one at a time to simplify the process.

1. Zoning Ordinance Amendment

Chairman Heath opened the Public Hearing to receive Public Comment. No one had any comments. Chairman Heath closed the Public Hearing. Chairman Heath called for a motion.

On motion by Commissioner Shackleford and seconded by Commissioner Jones the Board voted unanimously to approve the proposed Zoning Ordinance Amendment.

2. Subdivision Ordinance

Chairman Heath opened the Public Hearing to receive Public Comment. No one had any comments. Chairman Heath closed the Public Hearing. Chairman Heath called for a motion.

On motion by Commissioner Jones and seconded by Commissioner Shackleford the Board voted unanimously to approve the proposed Subdivision Ordinance Amendment.

3. Building Code Ordinance

Chairman Heath opened the Public Hearing to receive Public Comment. Commissioner Blizzard asked Mr. Scott Sutton for his comments. Mr. Sutton stated that these changes were overdue and will bring us into compliance with new legislation in N.C.G.S. Chapter 160D. Chairman Heath closed the Public Hearing. Chairman Heath called for a motion.

On motion by Commissioner Jones and seconded by Commissioner Shackleford the Board voted unanimously to approve the proposed Building Code Ordinance.

4. Flood Prevention Ordinance

Chairman Heath opened the Public Hearing to receive Public Comment. No one had any comments. Chairman Heath closed the Public Hearing. Chairman Heath called for a motion.

On motion by Commissioner Jones and seconded by Commissioner Shackleford the Board voted unanimously to approve the proposed Flood Prevention Ordinance.

F. PRESENTATIONS

1. Mr. McGugan, NC DEM presented an update on the HMPG 4285 Progress. Mr. McGugan went over all projects connected to HMPG 4285 and where they stand at this time. He asked for questions. Chairman Heath asked if we have any idea when the elevation changes might be approved. Mr. McGugan stated that once the changes are submitted and all documentation is correct and sent to FEMA they generally require 30-60 days to work these requests. Commissioner Shackleford asked if he feels these will be approved and Mr. McGugan stated he does not speculate on these but based on his experience they will be approved. Commissioner Blizzard asked about a report of money spent on these projects where in the report the percent complete does not add up at this point. Mr. McGugan stated that amount is for money received/spent not the work completed. This report comes from our firm working the projects along with the county input and approval. Mr. McGugan noted that this process will be changing for future disasters. The counties can opt into the new process or not. The state level will change where the state will go out and get the contracts for work needed and they will submit this information to FEMA and get the monies which will be paid to the counties versus the counties paying for the work and waiting to be reimbursed. Commissioner Blizzard asked about SARF Funds and Mr. McGugan explained what SARF Funds are and how they work. She also asked about the appraisal process for buy-outs and Mr. McGugan explained how that works also as to if the homeowner does not agree with the initial appraisal, the homeowner could pay to have a second appraisal done and if there is a huge difference between the two appraisals there would be a third appraisal done and the average of the three appraisals would be the final offer amount. She asked about the leasing out of the buy-out properties. Mr. McGugan stated that is permissible as long as all guidelines are followed. He said he has not seen a county lease agreement as of yet. Mr. DeHaven said he will send that to him for approval.

G. COUNTY MANAGER REPORT

1. Mr. DeHaven first presented a request to appoint two new members to the Board of Adjustments and re-appoint one member. Proper advertisements have been online and in the Standard. The Board of Adjustments recommends the reappointment of Mr. Henry Lanier and the appointment of Jessica Lynn Byrd and Shanita Edwards.

On motion by Commissioner Jones and seconded by Commissioner Shackelford, the Board voted unanimously to reappoint Mr. Henry Lanier and appoint Jessica Lynn Byrd and Shanita Edwards to the Board of Adjustment.

2. Mr. DeHaven next presented a request to reappoint Mr. Salvador Tinoco to the Planning Board for another term. The Planning Director recommends this reappointment.

On motion by Commissioner Blizzard and seconded by Commissioner Jones the Board voted unanimously to reappoint Mr. Salvador Tinoco to the Planning Board.

3. Mr. DeHaven next presented a request to appoint a new member to the DSS Board due to member being removed due to lack of attendance. The position was advertised as required and they received one application. The DSS Board approved the appointment of Mr. Trey Cash.

On motion by Commissioner Jones and seconded by Commissioner Shackelford the Board voted unanimously to approve the appointment of Mr. Trey Cash to the DSS Board.

4. Mr. DeHaven next presented a request for appointments and re-appointments to the Senior Center Advisory Committee. These positions were advertised as required in the Standard, Facebook Page and County Website. Six applications were received. Four for re-appointment and two new appointments. Ada Ashburn, Elaine Morgan, David Freeman, and Sheila Brann for re-appointment and Melinda Waters and Mary Bass for new appointment. The Senior Center Advisory Committee has approved these applications.

On motion by Commissioner Jones and seconded by Commissioner Blizzard, the Board voted unanimously to approve these Senior Center Advisory Committee appointments.

5. Mr. DeHaven next presented a request for re-appointment of two members to the Regional Aging Advisory Committee and one new appointment to this board as the current member did not want to remain on the board. Faye Taylor and Jean Garner applied to be re-appointed and Elliotte Ashburn applied to take the place of David Jones as the Greene County Delegate for the Senior Tar Heel Legislature. These positions were advertised in the local paper, facebook and county website.

On motion by Commissioner Blizzard and seconded by Commissioner Shackleford the Board voted unanimously to approve these appointments.

H. County Attorney Report

Nothing at this time.

I. Commissioner's Report and Recommendations

Commissioner Burress started by Congratulating the Greene Central Track and Field Team and the women's tennis team for advancing to the state tournament this past week. He also congratulated the Greene Central Baseball Coach, Scott Jones on his retirement. He also wanted to remind citizens that we are now into Hurricane Season and that multiple weather outlets are predicting that this year's season to be an active one. He wanted to remind everyone about the emergency notification system called "Code Red". This system can notify residents by phone, text, email and social media regarding time-sensitive general and emergency notifications. You can sign up for this service by visiting the county's website and clicking on the registration link under the Greene County Emergency Services page. He also noted he is disappointed with the volunteer EMS situation and hopes that this gets corrected tonight.

Commissioner Blizzard announced that Greene County has been removed from the Unit Assisted List with the Local Government Commission. She also noted there will be a Blood Drive on June 30th at the Wellness Center from 12-6 p.m., sponsored by Greene County Employees. Call to schedule an appointment at 1-800-733-2767. In addition, a new series called Cooking Matters at Home by Zoom will begin soon. Go to the county website under the Public Health page for more information. Commissioner Blizzard also asked about the body cams for the Sheriffs Department. Mr. DeHaven stated he has met with the sheriff and stated it is too late to apply for any grants and Commissioner Blizzard stated that the sheriff needs them immediately and asked for Mr. DeHaven to submit a budget amendment for the new budget year as soon as he can. Commissioner Blizzard then asked a pay study for paramedics, paramedic supervisor and EMS Director positions. Mr. DeHaven stated he has asked for this to be done for all staff. Commissioner Blizzard stated that it has been pointed out that in the FY 21/22 Budget Message that the Volunteer EMS Squads \$7,500 volunteer incentive is being removed as the less than 10% response rate does not justify appropriation of County funds for services not provided. She asked to discuss this issue tonight. Commissioner Blizzard made a motion that the \$7,500 appropriations be reinstated in the FY 21/22 Budget for the three volunteer EMS organizations as of July 1, 2021. The funds made payable to each squad by the 15th of July 2021. In addition, to establish quarterly meetings with Fire Chiefs, EMS Chief/Captains from Fort Run, Hookerton, and Maury along with Emergency Services personnel to prepare a plan that will establish financial stability and to improve the response rate with the volunteer squads in order to continue to provide emergency services in Greene County. Commissioner Burress seconded the motion. Commissioner Jones agrees with this motion. A vote was called and was approved unanimously.

Commissioner Blizzard asked the county attorney if three Commissioners meeting together is a majority and constitutes a Board of Commissioners meeting without making the other commissioners aware of said meeting. Attorney Stanley stated if the three together are discussing county business then yes it is a majority.

Chairman Heath asked Commissioner Blizzard to give a COVID update. She gave an update with the latest numbers and encouraged all who have not be vaccinated to do so and reminded all of lottery for all who have at least one vaccine will be entered for the lottery to receive a share of \$4 million.

Shackelford Jr, Commissioners Jerry Jones, Susan Blizzard, and Derek Burress, County Manager Kyle DeHaven, and Deputy Clerk Kathy Mooring. County Attorney Gay Stanley was absent due to court.

A. Call to Order

Chairman Bennie Heath called the meeting to order, and gave the Invocation and lead the Pledge to the Flag.

B. Approval of Agenda

Chairman Heath asked if there were any changes to the agenda as presented. Seeing as there were none he called for a motion to approve.

On motion by Commissioner Jones and seconded by Commissioner Shackelford, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Agenda as presented.

C. PUBLIC COMMENTS

None

D. COUNTY MANAGER REPORT

1. Mr. DeHaven first presented Participating Provider Agreements for the EMS Department. These agreements are necessary due to the Medicaid transformation-taking place. The Medicaid recipients are required to choose 1 of 5 Primary Health Providers. They are AmeriHealth Cantas, BCBS, United, Carolina Complete and Wellcare. Depending on whom the individual chooses for service, is whom our EMS billing company, Colleton will bill for services. The county is required to have contracts with each to recognize as a provider with billable authority. This new system and process takes effect July 1, 2021. Failure to have the appropriate contract in place will result in the inability to bill for services provided.

On motion by Commissioner Jones and seconded by Commissioner Blizzard, the Board voted unanimously to approve these agreements.

2. Mr. DeHaven next presented the FY 20/21 End of Year Budget Amendment. Commissioner Burress asked that Mr. DeHaven explain these amendments line by line. Commissioner Burress also requested that the Budget Amendment also be attached to these minutes, as it was not ready to be put in the agenda packet as posted.

On motion by Commissioner Jones and seconded by Commissioner Shackleford the Board voted unanimously to approve the End of Year Budget Amendment.

E. County Attorney Report

No report as attorney not present.

F. Commissioner's Report and Recommendations

Commissioner Burress apologized to the citizens for the technical difficulties that caused the county website not updating, making the agenda inaccessible this past weekend. He also noted that the budget amendments were not included in the original agenda packet so he requested that a copy of the amendments be added to the official meeting minutes. He congratulated the Greene Central Girls Tennis Team for competing in the State Tournament in Cary, NC. He also congratulated the Greene Central Boy's Track Team, which finished their season in Greensboro at NC A&T. Jonathon Willis, a sophomore placed fourth in the state in the 100-meter dash. He also recognized Miss Mia Allen, a graduating HOSA Senior who competed in the "personal care" category during the International Leadership Conference. Miss Allen finished 8th in the competition. He also noted that Senator Don Davis recognized Pastor Donald Riberio at Ormondsville Original Free Will Baptist Church with the Order of the Long Leaf Pine. This is a prestigious award presented by the Governor of North Carolina and is presented to individuals who have who have a proven record of extraordinary service to the state.

Commissioner Burress wanted to announce the July 4th is "Free Fishing Day" in North Carolina, where everyone, residents and non-residents can fish in any public body of water from 12:01a.m. to 11:59 p.m. without having to purchase a fishing license but all other fishing regulations apply, such as length and daily possession limits, as well as bait and tackle restrictions. He stated with the Snow Hill boat landing reopening this past weekend, the 4th of July is a great time to get outdoors and go fishing without having to worry about purchasing a license. Commissioner Burress also stated he had asked the county attorney to review the contract of the medical director at our last meeting and since the attorney is not here today asked for that update as soon as possible. He also asked for the minutes from the budget workshops be submitted for approval.

Commissioner Jones announced that the God & Country Day at Mt. Calvary will be on July 11th from 10:30 – 12:30.

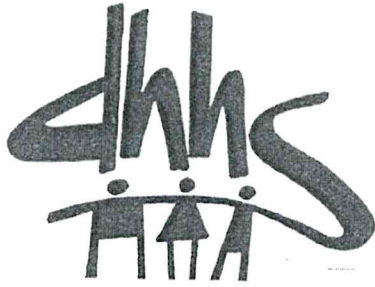

Fiscal Year 2020-2021 – GS 105-373(a)(3)

The Annual Settlement is composed of two parts: Exhibit B is Current year collections (2020) and Exhibit C is Prior Year Collections (2010-2019).

This report includes all levies and fees charged to the collector including fire districts, solid waste fees, county levy and levy for the Town of Walstonburg (real and personal property). Please remember that these reports do not include any tax collected through the North Carolina Vehicle Tag System (NCVTS) for motor vehicles. The collection rate analysis performed by the auditors in the annual audit is for the county levy only and includes the tax levy for funds collected through NCVTS for motor vehicles, which is a component of the general fund.

The total received (Exhibit B and Exhibit C) during fiscal year 2020-2021 (payments plus interest) was \$9,498,603.72 (includes all tax years 2010 through 2020).

Included in this total amount is the amount received for the current fiscal year 2020-2021 (Exhibit B): \$9,368,871.79 (payments plus interest). The overall collection rate indicated by this report (real and personal tax levy only) for the tax year 2020-2021 is 98.93%. This rate does not factor in the collection rate for levy from motor vehicles billed through the NCVTS system. The auditor's collection rate includes that levy. Factoring in those collections, the overall collection rate for the tax year 2020-2021 is estimated to be 99.17%.

Final Settlement for prior years (Exhibit C) is also attached (2010 – 2019). The total amount collected including all charges, interest and penalties for prior years was \$129,731.93.

Collection of all taxes in a timely manner still remains our priority. Please note that as the collection rate moves upward for the current year; prior year collections will go down accordingly. Since the billing of motor vehicles is no longer a part of Ad Valorem Tax and has always been a major portion of prior year collections, we will need to be prudent in the amount budgeted for prior year collections.

- 3) Collection Order for Fiscal Year 2021-2022

Per GS 105-321(b), the collection order must be entered to constitute the collector's authority to enter upon the collection of taxes and to exercise the various powers incident to the collection process. A copy of the order is attached.

SECTION 31. REVENUE NEUTRAL RATE

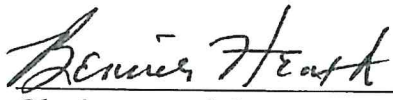
The general reappraisal of real property for Greene County occurs once every eight years. State law requires that units of local government, including public authorities, publish a revenue-neutral tax rate in the budget immediately following the completion of the general reappraisal of real property. The purpose for the revenue-neutral tax rate is to provide citizens with comparative information. The FY 2021-2022 operating budget follows the general reappraisal for real property for Greene County. The revenue-neutral property tax rate is the rate that is estimated to produce revenue for the next fiscal year equal to the revenue that would have been produced for the next fiscal year by the current tax rate if no reappraisal had occurred. The rate is then adjusted by a growth factor equal to the average annual percentage increase in the tax base due to the improvements since the last general appraisal. The reappraisal produced a tax base of \$1,249,924,531 for Greene County. The tax levy for the current fiscal year is \$9,235,014 and the growth factor since the last general reappraisal is 1.66% using the formula mandated by state law, the revenue neutral-tax rate for Greene County is .751 cents per hundred dollar valuation. The proposed tax rate for 2021-2022 is .786 cents per hundred dollar valuation which remains equal to the rate from 2020-2021.

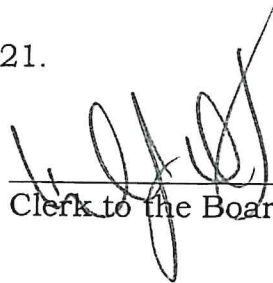
SECTION 32. DELEGATED AUTHORITY
