The Greene County Board of Commissioners met in regular session on Monday, March 18, 2024, at 7:00 p.m. in the Greene County Operations Center. Present for the meeting: Chairman Bennie Heath, Vice Chairman James T. Shackleford Jr, Commissioners Jerry Jones, Derek Burress, and Ray Johnson. County Manager Kyle DeHaven, County Attorney Gay Stanley, and Deputy Clerk Kathy Mooring.

A. Call to Order

Chairman Bennie Heath called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m., and asked Commissioner James Shackleford to give the Invocation and lead the Pledge to the Flag.

There were four Greene County staff in attendance and six people from the public present.

B. Approval of Agenda

Chairman Heath asked if there were any changes to the proposed Agenda. Seeing as none, he called for a motion.

On motion by Commissioner Jones and seconded by Commissioner Johnson, the Board voted unanimously to approve the agenda.

C. Consent Agenda

Chairman Heath asked for any changes/corrections to the Consent Agenda. Seeing as none, he called for a motion to approve.

On motion by Commissioner Jones and second by Commissioner Johnson, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Consent Agenda as presented.

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D. Public Comments

1. Anthony Darden, American Legion Post 536. Mr. Darden came representing Post 536 and they declined the offer to rent the County Building previously rented to the VFW (See Post 536 letter to the County Manager).
2. Jimmy Sutton, 248 Preacher Kearney Rd., Snow Hill. Mr. Sutton came to ask why the Sheriff's Office is not doing anything about traffic on his road and farmer spraying fields when the spray is coming onto his property and vehicles.

E. Presentation

1. Jami Williams, Chamber of Commerce Director. Ms. Williams came to introduce herself and to acquire the Board of Commissioners help in getting Chamber positions filled. Chairman Heath said they would be happy to start this process for her.

F. County Manager

1. Mr. DeHaven presented a request to appoint two people to the Trillium Regional Advisory Board. This was done in February 19th, 2024 meeting and then was rescinded. Per N.C.G.S. 122C-118.1 which defines the criteria necessary to fill the board legally. This needs to be done for this Board's first meeting on March 26th. Chairman Heath nominated Commissioner Jones to fill the Commissioner position and after further discussion it was decided to wait to appoint other position until after the first meeting of the advisory board.

On motion by Commissioner Johnson and seconded by Commissioner Jones, the Board voted unanimously to appoint Commissioner Jones to the Trillium Regional Advisory Board and wait to appoint someone to the other position.

2. Mr. DeHaven next presented a proposed fee schedule amendment for EMS. The proposed fee schedule increase for three services provided by our EMS system was recommended by our third-party billing company for billing allowances due to Medicare increases. Commissioner Burress stated he has concerns about the EMS billing process utilizing a third-party company. He stated he would like a comprehensive overview with details on: 1. How patient information and service details are transmitted to initiate invoices; 2. Quality control measures to prevent errors; and 3. The process for identifying and correcting errors. He stated he understands the rationale behind recommending increased EMS fees to exceed new insurance allowances, but he opposes such a move.

On motion by Commissioner Jones and seconded by Commissioner Johnson, the Board voted 4 to 1 (Commissioner Burress) to approve the new fee schedule.

3. Mr. DeHaven next presented a request for approval of a Sole Source Purchase request for Communications. Recently a Budget Amendment was submitted appropriating funds in fund 16 (Emergency Telephone System Fund) for the purchase of an updated recording system. The purpose was to replace a system that had reached its end of useful life with a new system to serve our needs. Our current vendor, Carolina Recording Systems, has provided us a quote to replace the equipment that has reached end of life. CRS is the only certified manufacturer dealer with the ability to migrate our data from our existing recorder to the new recorder proposed for use, and has provided us with certification verifying they are the sole service provider Pursuant to Greene County Purchasing Policy, Article 5, Section X and N.C.G.S. 143-129E (6), the usage of Sole Source purchases requires the approval of the Board of Commissioners.

On motion by Commissioner Jones and seconded by Commissioner Shackleford, the Board voted unanimously to approve this Sole Source Purchase.

4. Mr. DeHaven next presented a Resolution in Support of Relocating the Senior Center. Mr. DeHaven stated the Resolution is in support of the proposed relocation and construction of a new Senior Center. He also stated if funding were to be attained, the opportunity to relocate the Senior Center to the Athletic Complex could benefit both departments.

On motion by Commissioner Jones and seconded by Commissioner Shackleford, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Resolution.

G. County Attorney Report

No comment.

H. Commissioner's Report and Recommendations

Chairman Heath said on February 19th the County Manager Kyle DeHaven brought a proposal to the Board from a local company that sets up bins for used clothes, shoes and books and the Board approved this project and the bins have arrived and are ready for use. He thanked the County Manager for bringing this project to Greene County. These items will be used for those in need. Chairman Heath stated there are many events happening around the County: Free Union Church Annual BBQ plate sale is on April 13th; Jerusalem Church Pancake Dinner is March 22nd; Shine Fire Department Reverse Drawing is April 6th; Travel Baseball Team Golf Tournament at Cutter Creek is April 5th and of course March Madness, wishes everyone's team the best of luck. Commissioner Burress made comments about the County Attorney's comments during the March 4th meeting of the Board and he disagrees with entering closed session on matters that were previously discussed in open session. He also has concerns about how certain reports and documents are provided to Commissioners days after the presentations have already occurred. He thanked Director Kearney for the fire service delivery system analysis, but requested a more detailed presentation addressing the issues and concerns raised.

I. ADJOURN

On motion by Commissioner Jones and second by Commissioner Johnson to adjourn the meeting, the Board voted unanimously to adjourn. The meeting adjourned at 7:45 p.m.

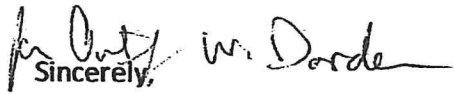

On February 12, 2024, members of American Legion Post 536, met with Greene County, County Manager Kyle Dehaven (Per his request) at the former Greene County Health Department (Former VFW) building to discuss a proposal for Post 536 to acquire the building.

Mr. DeHaven greeted post members upon his arrival and initiated a conversation by explaining that the building was vacant and available for use once it had been renovated and met minimum county codes for use and occupancy. He passed around a price quote dated October 25, 2023 prepared by Hilliard Construction Co. Inc. The quote outlined the minimum repairs that must be made before our post could rent and occupy the building. The total cost of repairs listed on the quote totaled \$226,000. The prices do not include interior renovation other than exterior walls. This meant total renovation cost would be much higher.

Mr. DeHaven stated that the county was not interested in relinquishing the building once repairs were made because the building sits on prime property. He stated once renovations were completed and the building met county codes, the county would establish guidelines for the post to rent the building. Post members immediately realized that what was being proposed for our post to acquire the building was illogical. Several post members immediately turned and walked away in disbelief expressing this meeting is nonsense and a waste of our time. No one in their right mind would agree to a proposal like this.

Post 536 is 501C and operates on donations. Therefore, it is not in the post best interest to accept your proposal.

Consideration of Late Application for Present Use Value

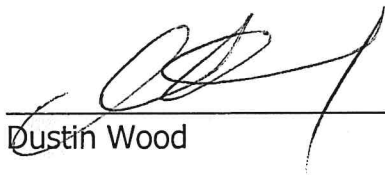

A Resolution is attach authorizing the use of facsimile, better known as electronic signatures is attached.

Electronic signatures will allow for better efficiencies and improved separation of duties in the Finance Department. Security measures in place within the Financial Management System (MUNIS - Tyler ERP), include a work flow process in which the signer must approve the item to be paid in order to place the signature on the check. Signatures are only associated with the signer's log-in credentials. In short, no other person will be able to electronically place a signature on a check other than the finance officer.

Electronic signatures are allowed by general statute 159-28.1 and are being utilized in other counties. According to Ms. Stanley, there is no history of legal cases that involve electronic signatures.

LINE WORKER APPRECIATION DAY

WHEREAS, on April 10, 2013, a resolution was passed in the United States Senate to recognize April 18 annually as National Lineman (Line Worker) Appreciation Day; and

WHEREAS, the profession of the electrical line worker is steeped in personal, family, and professional tradition; and

WHEREAS, line workers are often first responders during storms and other catastrophic events, working to make the scene safe for other public safety officials, and to expedite the return of vital electrical power to our communities; and

WHEREAS, these brave men and women work with thousands of volts of electricity high atop power lines 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, risking and sometimes losing their lives to keep electricity flowing; and

WHEREAS, line workers are often faced with dangerous conditions, far from their families, as they work to construct and maintain energy infrastructure throughout the State of North Carolina and the United States; and

WHEREAS, line workers must use their technical knowledge, physical strength and ingenuity to achieve success in challenges they face every day; and

WHEREAS, Greene County thanks these skilled and heroic line workers who brave hurricanes, ice storms, snow storms, floods, and other natural disasters to maintain our community's energy grid.
