The Greene County Board of Commissioners met in regular session on Monday, February 21, 2022 at 7:00 p.m. in the Greene County Operations Center. Present for the meeting: Chairman Bennie Heath, Vice Chairman James T. Shackleford Jr, Commissioners Jerry Jones, Susan Blizzard and Derek Burress, County Manager Kyle DeHaven, County Attorney Gay Stanley and Deputy Clerk Kathy Mooring.

A. Call to Order

Chairman Bennie Heath called the meeting to order, and asked Commissioner Burress to give the invocation and lead the Pledge to the Flag.

B. Approval of Agenda

Chairman Heath asked for any changes to the agenda, Commissioner Blizzard stated that #7 under County Manager Report should read University of Mount Olive not Mount Olive College.

On motion by Commissioner Jones and seconded by Commissioner Blizzard, the Board voted unanimously to approve the agenda with the noted correction.

C. Consent Agenda

Chairman Heath asked if there were any changes to the Consent Agenda, Commissioner Blizzard noted that C5, Budget Amendment needed County Manager's signature.

On motion by Commissioner Jones and second by Commissioner Shackleford the Board voted unanimously to approve the Consent Agenda.

E. Presentation

1. Calyn Taylor/Emily Hardy – FFA Proclamation. Ms. Taylor the Greene County FFA presented a FFA Proclamation for the Boards approval and she went over what the FFA is doing for National FFA Week.

On motion by Commissioner Jones and seconded by Commissioner Blizzard the Board voted unanimously to approve the Proclamation declaring February 19 – 26, 2022 National FFA Week.

F. County Manager Report

1. Mr. DeHaven presented a Budget Amendment to balance Fund 16 with the Greene County's Emergency Telephone System Fund Balance per the NC 911 Board.

On motion by Commissioner Jones and seconded by Commissioner Shackleford the Board voted unanimously to approve the Budget Amendment.

2. Mr. DeHaven next presented a Budget Amendment from the EMS Department. Mr. DeHaven explained this is for the Zoll Defibrillator Monitor purchase/trade in of Lifepak Defibrillators previously included in FY22 budget entries are for proper accounting treatment of financing agreement.

On motion by Commissioner Jones and seconded by Commissioner Shackleford the Board voted unanimously to approve the Budget Amendment.

3. Mr. DeHaven next presented a Resolution in support of the Eastern Carolina Council of Government as they make necessary administrative changes to more adequately provide the services as provided by other Council of Government.

On motion by Commissioner Jones and seconded Commissioner Shackleford the Board voted unanimously to approve the Resolution.

4. Mr. DeHaven next presented a request for approval of RFQ high scorer for the Internal Air Quality and Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning. Mr. DeHaven went over the scoring process and the results. Three RFQ's received. The scoring process was done by the County Manager and two other individuals. Commissioner Burress asked if this would give the high scorer a blank check to do the work needed. Mr. DeHaven explained that the company with the highest scorer would be asked to submit a quote for the work to be done and the Board of Commissioners would have to approve the quote for the work needed if the County Manager could not approve the work himself. Commissioner Burress went over the scoring sheet and said he feels the scoring process was biased. Mr. DeHaven said it was not biased, but the RFQ process is required and it felt the RFQ is intended to help us determine the best company to do the work needed for the County. Commissioner Blizzard said she agrees with Commissioner Burress that the evaluation question #3 is biased because it is asking about familiarity with the client, facilities and equipment. Mr. DeHaven stated that we want a company that will install equipment and service said equipment and be familiar with the equipment. Commissioner Burress read the evaluation questions out loud and feels they are not fair questions. Mr. DeHaven stated this is not a quote for work to be done it is for the purpose to see who qualifies to bid on work to be done. Commissioner Blizzard stated that question #3 is biased and does feel it is giving the applicants a fair opportunity.

On motion by Commissioner Jones and seconded by Commissioner Shackleford to approve the high scorer of the RFQ for Internal Air Quality and Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning, Chairman Heath asked the County Attorney Gay Stanley if this process was legal, she stated not only is it legal but it is necessary, the Board voted 3 yays and 2 nays (Commissioner Blizzard and Burress) to approve the high scorer.

5. Mr. DeHaven next presented a request to purchase a new ambulance that needs to be ordered now and received in the next Fiscal Year. Mr. DeHaven noted that we have an opportunity to be placed in the “que” at a very high priority level that would gain us an ambulance in four to five months. Mr. DeHaven noted that 37% of the monies needed would come from operational funds since we have SKIF funds and 63% from Grant funds. The cost of a new ambulance is \$275,000 and it would replace one of the current fleet. Commissioner Blizzard asked about the remount program and Mr. DeHaven advised we do not qualify for a remount at this time. All of our ambulances have been remounted three times and that is all that is allowed in this program.

On motion by Commissioner Jones and seconded by Commissioner Shackelford, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Ambulance purchase.

6. Mr. DeHaven next presented a Memorandum of Understanding with the Greg Isley Firm to provide accounting oversight/book keeping services until the firing process finds us the qualified applicant needed to fill current vacancies.

On motion by Commissioner Jones and seconded by Commissioner Shackelford the Board voted unanimously to approve the MOU with Greg Isley Firm.

7. Mr. DeHaven next presented a Memorandum of Understanding with the University of Mount Olive. The MOU will allow County Staff to take courses at a reduced rate and the County will in turn market this program to County employees.

On motion by Commissioner Jones and seconded by Commissioner Blizzard the Board voted unanimously to approve this MOU with the University of Mount Olive.

Mr. DeHaven asked the Board how they felt about having a mini-retreat here in Greene County in the Conference Room at the County Complex to go over all monies being received and how we can spend said monies. All said that would be a good idea and asked to have it before the next meeting. Mr. DeHaven announced the Grand Opening for the Operations Center will be Wednesday, March 2, 2022 at 11 a.m.

G. County Attorney Report

Ms. Stanley noted that on the MOU with Greg Isley firm when signed need to scratch out the statement on page 2 about an attached addendum – we did not receive any attachments. Ms. Stanley also went over the appointment of an interim sheriff after she discussed the situation with a fellow attorney who has handled this many times. She stated that the Board can appoint an interim sheriff at anytime once it is made public that this position is becoming vacant, the Board can make the appointment effective the date that the position is to be vacant. The Chief Deputy

will be acting as sheriff until the appointment is made by the Board of Commissioners. As far as the Board going into closed session to discuss the candidates wishing to be appointed to the interim position is legal and is a standard practice of the Boards to discuss qualifications for this position as they would do for any other position as needed.

H. Commissioner's Report and Recommendations

Commissioner Burress congratulated the Greene Central Basketball Team on finishing second at the conference tournament and making it to the playoffs again this year. He also congratulated Greene Central Senior Jacob Beamon for winning the Conference Championship and 2A Eastern Regional and qualified for the state tournament in Greensboro where he finished 8th in the heavyweight division. He also recognized Nathan Drake and McKinsey Harper for being named male and female athletes of the fall. Commissioner Burress also took a moment to thank everyone who helped to get the homeless family into a house and the said house is now called "Hope House" and will be used for other residents who find themselves on hard times and give these families get back on their feet. He also recognized the school system for stepping up and honoring the victims of the plane crash that occurred off the coast this past weekend. He also thanked Greene Lamp for their donation of the solar charging station at the Wellness Center. He also noted that on Wednesday, February 23rd, Mount Calvary hosted a chili and grilled cheese supper to raise fund for junior camp. On Saturday, February 26th there was a Black History Month Parade in downtown Snow Hill that started at the Greene County Operations Center and ended at the courthouse. He then reminded everyone that the county currently has 21 vacant positions open that can be viewed on the county website and Facebook page. He also noted that citizens can sign up for the county's newsletter which will keep you updated on any new openings. The county has great benefits and as you saw tonight, the Board approved an agreement with the University of Mount Olive to provide scholarships for county employees. He also noted that he has gotten several complaints from concerned citizens about employees engaging in campaign-related activities while on the clock for the county and also while using county resources, specifically county vehicles. He encouraged all department heads to remind and review with their staff that the county does have an electioneering policy in place. He also noted that at the last meeting the Board received an update on ARP Funds. They also got an update on the broadband situation and an email explaining the administration's broadband interpretation. While he agrees they should wait and see if the school system receives the NTIA grant they have applied for, he wanted to go on record saying he disagrees with the interpretation provided at the last meeting that local internet service providers (ISP's) currently providing broadband services using state and federal funds are ineligible for county funding. He thanked Sheriff Lemmie Smith and his wife Sue Smith for their service to the county and wished them well in their retirement.

Commissioner Jones noted there will be a retirement celebration at the Senior Center for Sue Smith on March 3rd. Commissioner Blizzard noted that Election filing starts back-up on February 24th and runs through March 4th. Chairman Heath gave a COVID update.

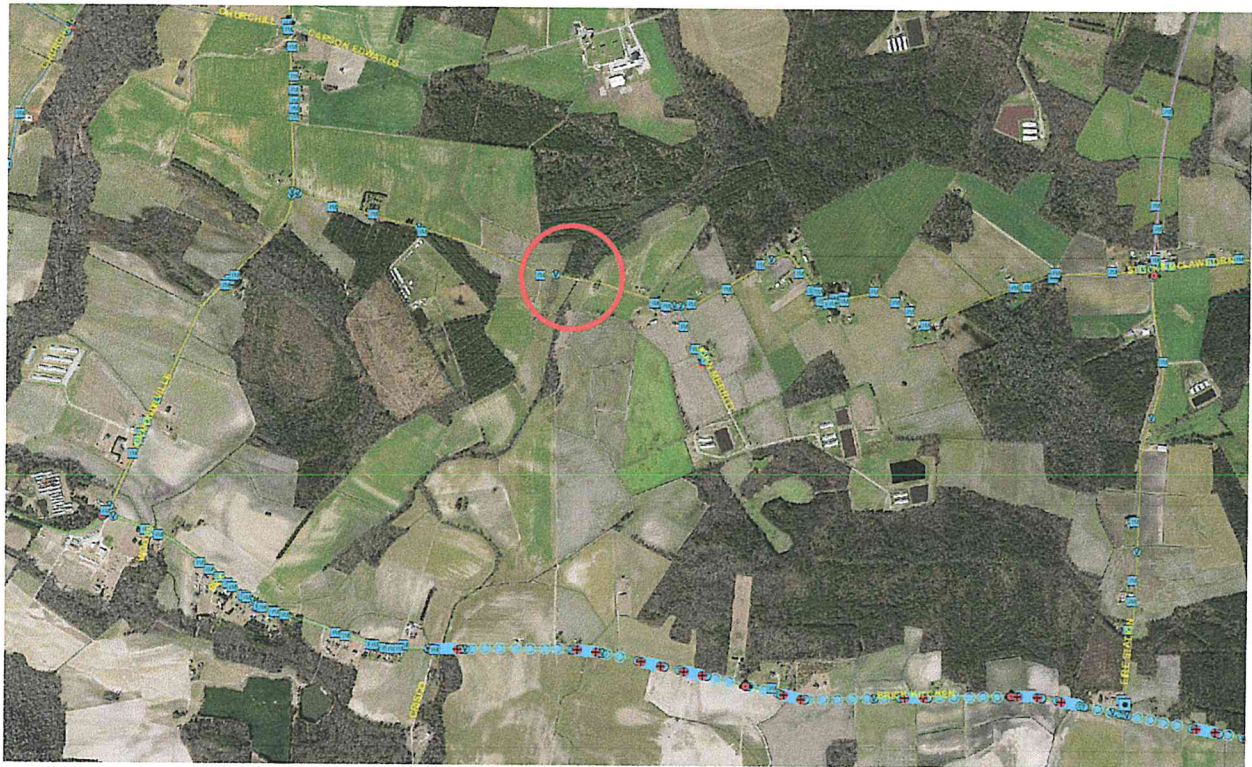

Stocks McLawhorn Road Water Line Replacement
Contract No. 1 – Polecat Creek Water Line Replacement
March 7, 2022

Greene County operates a 6" diameter waterline along Stocks McLawhorn Road. The waterline crosses Polecat Creek between Ormondsville Road and John Merritt Road. The NC Department of Transportation plans to replace the bridge crossing Polecat Creek with a large box culvert. NCDOT construction requires relocation/replacement of the Greene County waterline that crosses Polecat Creek. NCDOT has agreed to pay Greene County to relocate the waterline and has executed a Utility Relocation Agreement with Greene County. The following is a map exhibit showing approximate location of the crossing:



Based on the executed agreement, bids for construction were received. The low bid was submitted by Herring Rivenbark, Inc.

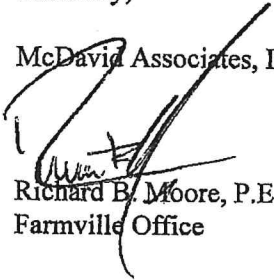

BIOGRAPHY

We are delighted to report to you that one hundred and five (105) entities have voted “yes” to display “In God We Trust” in and on their government buildings. Thus far 250 plus displays have been permanently installed in 59 NC counties and 46 town halls. In addition to providing these permanent displays on public buildings, some 50 plus N.C. sheriff departments, 40 plus police departments, and 30 plus fire department fleets have installed over 3500 “In God We Trust” reflective decals on their vehicles. All of this is a result of the efforts by the US Motto Action Committee, which after procuring the approvals by the government bodies, pays for all the cost of these displays.

It all began on November 26, 2002, when with a desire to promote patriotism; Rick Lanier led the Davidson County Board of Commissioners to publicly display “In God We Trust” on the exterior of the Davidson County Governmental Center, on which the installation was completed December 29, 2002. December 30, 2002 Rick co-founded the US Motto Action Committee.

On June 24, 2003 two ACLU funded attorneys filed a Federal lawsuit against Davidson County citing that the motto violated the “Separation of Church and State”. Due to the proactive efforts of the USMAC the Davidson County Board of Commissioners unanimously decided to accept the assistance of the NC Association of County Commissioners and fight the lawsuit, all agreeing that it was worth the fight. In May 2004, U.S. District Court Judge William Osteen, Sr. dismissed the lawsuit, citing no church/state conflict. On May 13, 2005 the U.S. 4th Circuit Court of Appeals affirmed Judge Osteen’s opinion. Then in finality, on November 14, 2005 the U.S. Supreme Court refused to hear the case, thus making the 4th Circuit Court of Appeals ruling case law. (Ref. 407F 3d 266 Lambeth v. The Board of Commissioners of Davidson County, North Carolina, Case No. 04-1753 4th Circuit Court of Appeals).

The mission statement of the USMAC is To defend, promote and assist in the awareness and furtherance of our U.S. motto, “In God We Trust” on public buildings, structures, monuments, the printed page, and to encourage our Godly Heritage in various other aspects. The immediate goal of the USMAC is to reach all 100 NC counties and as many town halls as possible with a request to prominently and proudly display our great motto.

For the last 7 years we have made it our goal to tirelessly contribute many hours of our time in making this effort a reality. We do all this with a deeply held conviction that our Nation’s identity and spiritual heritage are worth the effort. Many county and city leaders have shared the same conviction, which has resulted in this organization’s overwhelming success.

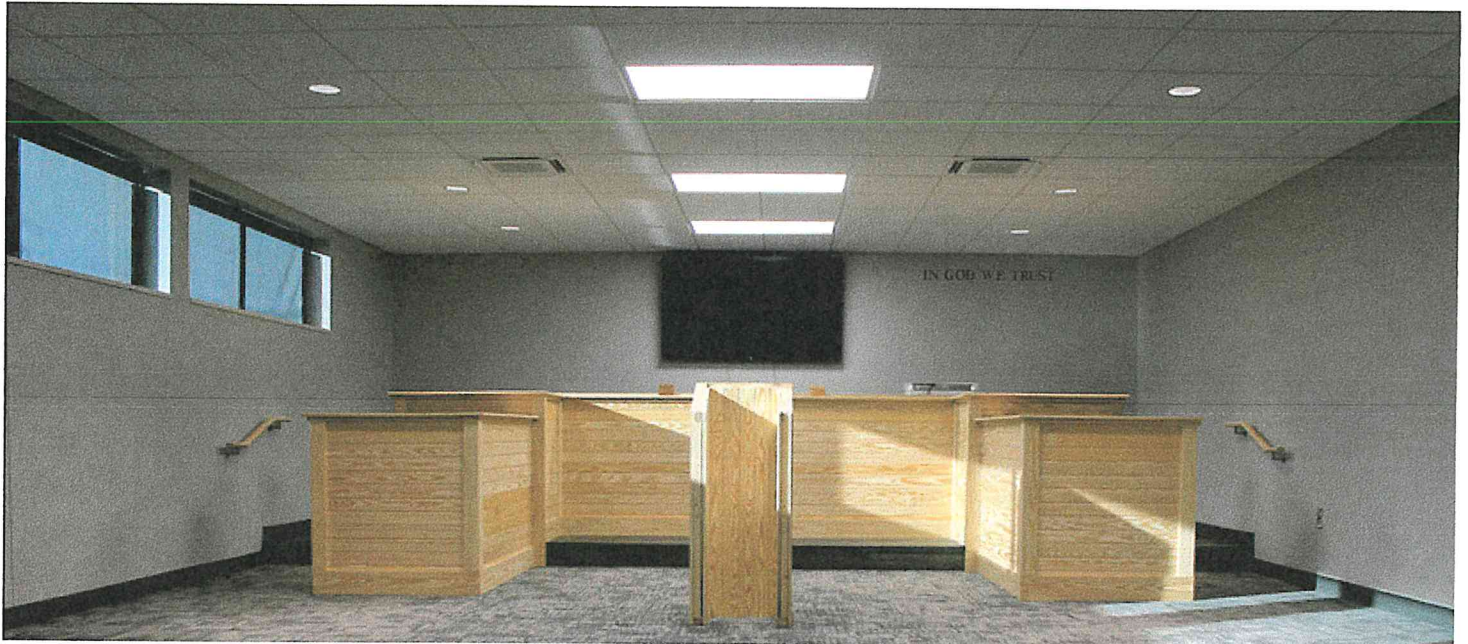
